Wool Felt Tool Roll

This rolled tool caddy is a great way to store knitting needles, paintbrushes, pens, pencils, markers or anything else you can think of.

Step 1

Cut a piece of wool felt to 15" x 25". This will be the outside fabric.

NOTE: If you don't have any wool felt on hand, use whatever fabrics you have. Cotton, denim, linen and canvas will all work very nicely for this project.

Step 2

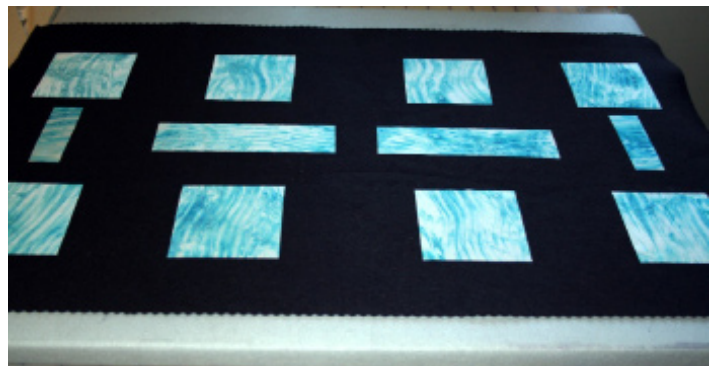
Apply Mistyfuse to the fabric scraps you will use as the appliques on the front of the tool caddy.

Step 3

Cut out your appliqué shapes and fuse them to the front of the needle case piece, keeping your shapes 1" from any edge.

Supplies

- Wool felt
- Fabric scraps
- Mistyfuse
- Parchment paper
- Ribbon



Step 4

Add some decorative stitching and trim the piece to 14" x 24". I like to use a decorative rotary cutter for this.



Step 5

Cut a piece of wool felt 24" x 14" for the lining and a piece for the pocket 24" x 8".

Step 6

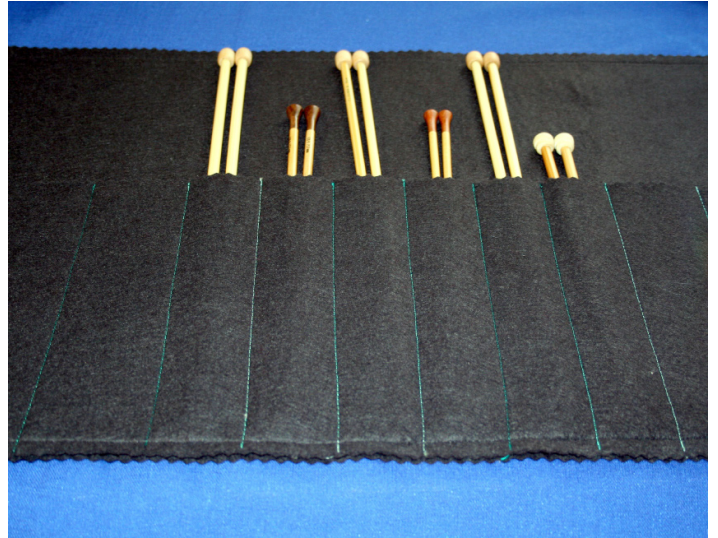
Place the pocket piece on the lining aligning the bottom edge and sew channels in whatever widths you desire.

Step 7

Cut a piece of ribbon 18" long and fold it in half. With the lining side of the tool caddy right side down, place the folded edge of the ribbon along the left edge, centering it from top to bottom and about 1" in from the edge and pin it in place.

Step 8

Apply Mistyfuse to the wrong side of the outside fabric piece and fuse it, wrong sides together, to the lining piece, removing the pin holding the ribbon tie in place before you press the piece with the iron. Stitch around the outer edge of the tool caddy using a 1/2" seam allowance.



Slip your tools and brushes in the channels, roll up the case and tie the ribbons into a bow.
